DSSAB provides social services throughout the District, including Children's Services, Income Support and Stability, Housing Services, and Violence Against Women programs. To build community awareness, they've offered to attend a future Council meeting to provide an overview. Offer accepted. District has 22 municipalities and unincorporated areas, presentations will be spread out.

14. Armour Mayor Rod Ward update on MAHC Hospital Local Share

The Almaguin Highlands has targeted a range of \$2m to \$9.5m, the target overall is \$12m over 12 years, with \$2.5m remaining in Almaguin and \$9.5m going toward MAHC Local Share.

15. Armour Mayor Rod Ward additional update on MAHC Hospital Local Share; Almaguin asked to ante up \$11 million for new hospitals, North Bay Nugget article

Mayor Ward clarifies, the article states that the 20% Almaguin portion is to be allocated to the health centre in Burks Falls and this is not the intent, the intent is to hold back 20% for healthcare in the Almaguin Highlands, this could include healthcare needs anywhere in the Highlands.

17. JBC CBO module in CGIS program

Reviewed and discussed. MBS/CBO (Manager of Building Services/Chief Building Official) is setting

up CBO module in the CGIS (Centre for Geographic Information Systems) – Spatial Land Information Management System (SLIMS) Services. The cost of this program will be billed to and paid for by the JBC through the permit fees collected and has been added to the budget proposal this year. E-permitting is also being looked at, which will be no extra cost. Access to property files is the document file that appears on the CGIS program. CBO module should be a read only option to allow 2 staff members access from each office. This will enable us to see issued permits and inspections conducted. Information requested on shared drive and who manages our internet access/router.

We contacted CGIS to determine the property files. The property files don't exist within CGIS, they would gain access through our system to the digitization file jointly done in 2015 through Blue Sky. This information isn't current and we don't have the IT staff to support it. As such, given the limited information available and considering the security of our network, we're unable to provide access.
